

Animal and bird life during June

There have been the most baby rabbits we have seen for some years. Badgers are also very much on the increase with our sandy/clay surrounding soil making good breeding for them. Squirrels have also grown in number – maybe a few too many. Some years ago we had a pure white albino Squirrel at our end of the village although most young are born half white. There are more Hares around at the moment but not many Foxes and Weasels and Stoats many be seen on the footpaths. Deer are increasing, especially the small Muntjac so watch your young trees and shrubs.

Until we do a bird count and survey, it's hard to know what has survived but Red Kite numbers have doubled as have Rooks, Crows and Jackdaws. There are many Starlings and Pigeons on the feeding tables, but not so with our own Owls. What we did see in our garden one late afternoon was a Goshawk and its young take two Pigeons, leaving just their feathers.

You have reported to us about reptiles with Frogs, a few Toads, Adders, Grass snakes and Great Crested Newts of both sexes have been seen.

SESAW

At the time of writing, our volunteers are wilting and the dogs have flopped down in the shade during the July heatwave. Thank you to everyone who helped our Newton Green sale to raise over £800 plus a generous amount from an anonymous donor.

If you enjoy a Rummage Sale, make sure you visit SESAW during August. We are clearing out stock which has piled up over the last two years. The marquee will be full of bargains, from pictures to pottery and books to bric a brac, furniture and flowers. Roll up 10am – 3pm, any Saturday or Sunday in August. Arrive earlier if you wish to view the animals, the rehoming side closes at 1pm.

Like many rescues, we are full up with cats, dogs and rabbits and more waiting to come in. One example is Suzanne, a tabby and white cat approximately ten years old, She was found in a distressed condition sitting in the gutter by the side of a busy road. She loves a fuss, has a healthy appetite and is probably best suited as an indoor cat in an adult



household. If you are looking for a new pet to share your home, we are still open 10am to 1pm, Friday to Sunday during the Summer but check first to avoid disappointment.

Before my stroke last year, I hadn't given too much thought to issues surrounding wheelchair access to shops, restaurants and football stadia. I had assumed legislation was in place obliging businesses and public bodies to treat disabled people on the same basis as everyone else. If that meant spending a few quid on ramps and rails, get on with it because it's the right thing to do and not just to stay on the right side of the law. I have become a bit militant about these matters and recently had a right old rant at a manager of a Hadleigh supermarket who had allowed pallets of garden produce to block wheelchair access to the shop.



I was therefore delighted to see the good folk at the Community Centre had installed new parking bays for users with mobility issues. My thanks to Margaret Langton, Jane Whyman and the Community Council for making it happen. Thanks also to the Parish Council, especially Peter Eaton who, as ever, has been doggedly determined to drive the project forward, and thanks to County Councillor Chris Hudson and District Councillor Dave Busby for using their local budgets to help fund the works. I would also like to thank Daniel and Natasha at The George for the huge amount of work they have recently had completed to enhance access to the pub for disabled people.

Notes from the meeting of the Parish Council held on Thursday 14 July 2022

Present at the meeting: Parish Councillors, District Councillor David Busby, a member of the public

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR REPORT

Chairman Les Cole thanked Dave Busby for Baberghs contribution to the costs of disabled parking bays now installed at the Community Hall.

Cllr Busby provided a copy of a presentation from Highways England regarding the A14 J50 to J55 Road Improvement works. A schedule of works included the following:-

A14 Eastbound and Westbound Copdock Resurfacing J55

- Phase 1 25-Jul-22 to 10-Aug-22 EB
- Phase 2 12-Sep-22 to 23-Sep-22 WB

A14 Skid Resistance Eastbound Works J52 - 25-Jul-22 to 10-Aug-22

A14 Needham to Claydon Safety Barrier Renewal - 08-Aug-22 to end of Sep-22

A14 Ipswich Park & Ride Signage – date to be confirmed Further details can be found at https://nationalhighways.co.uk/our-roads/east/#roadprojectform

APPLICATION FOR OUTLINE PLANNING

PERMISSION - DC/19/00567 Proposal: Hybrid Application comprising Outline Planning Application (Access to be considered) for the erection of up to 92 homes and 13 self-build/custom build plots (including provision of up to 37 affordable homes); open space, including a village wood; land for community use/ local shops/ office space; land for a village car park; land for an extension to existing village allotments; land for paddocks; land for relocated and enhanced caravan storage provision; safeguarded land for potential future relief road; new public right of way and associated infrastructure provision. Application has now been withdrawn and will no longer be determined by the Council. Comments on this application are no longer required.

PIIP (PARISH INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT PLAN)

Chairman Les Cole discussed the concept of the PIIP and described how it can help communities focus and prioritise their infrastructure spending. The PIIP is in its draft stages at the moment and the Parish Council is keen to engage the local community to help identify the community infrastructure needs and aspirations and determine what funding might be needed to achieve this.

SPEEDWATCH

Chairman Les Cole discussed his concerns and contact with Highways regarding traffic speed in Duke Street and the dangers of Policemans Corner. A road traffic survey undertaken by Highways England would be expensive but may be considered necessary.

A member of public asked if the survey could be extended to George Street/Silver Hill. Traffic reports record a greater volume of traffic passing through George Street but traffic speeds are much faster travelling through Duke Street. An additional VAS sign will cost £2500 with added costs of £500 for a post.

CHATTISHAM PLAYING FIELD

Concerns were raised regarding the deterioration of play equipment on Chattisham Playing Field. It is understood that the Community Council are undertaking a risk assessment of the equipment.


