



DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORT

In Dave Busby's absence District Councillor, John Whyman reported. BDC website has now been upgraded. Part one of the Joint Local Planning Policy should be completed in the next few weeks, with part two due in 2025.

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

Peter Beale requested some bark mulch to repair wet footpaths.

Richard Young reported a recent accident at Silver Hill.

PLANNING

DC/21/02623 Land adjacent to the Old Rectory, The Street, Chattisham. An appeal has been lodged for the erection of one dwelling, cart lodge and alteration of access.

DC/23/04442 Erection of two signs at the entrance to Woodlands Farm Shop, Silver Hill, Hintlesham - Granted.

DC/22/04875 Vine Cottage, Duke Street, Hintlesham. Erection of two storey extension, access and parking - Granted.

DC/23/03922 Land to rear of Vine Cottage, Duke Street, Hintlesham, change of use from Agricultural land to residential amenity land – Granted.

We shall remember ...

On Remembrance Sunday, a congregation of around 60 people, led by the Rev Geoffrey Clement attended an outdoor service at St Nicholas Church in Hintlesham. The names of the fallen listed on the war memorial were commemorated, and Gerald Main told the story of Ethel Mary Tate, who served in the Great War as a nurse serving in a VAD (Voluntary Aid Detachment)

Ethel was born in Woodbridge in 1870 and, at the outbreak of WW1, she was one of 50,000 volunteers who joined the VAD. As a nurse, she could have been sent to a field hospital near the front, or, nearer to home, tasked to help in a hospital, striving to rehabilitate casualties recuperating from their injuries. These hospitals were often located in grand country houses which was, of course, the case at Hintlesham Hall. You can imagine these VAD nurses escorting recovering service men from the Hall to the church and back each Sunday.



She would have received training in first aid, basic nursing and in hygiene, on the road to becoming a VAD nurse. Ethel clearly made good progress and became a Quartermaster at Eastern House in Woodbridge and was, in effect, 2 nd in command of the Hospital detachment. It was there that she contracted pneumonia in December 1915. Later that month, Ethel came to Hintlesham where she visited her sister, who was married to the local rector, Oswald Anstruther Wilkinson. It was during that visit that she died from pneumonia.

You can't help but feel desperately sorry for Reverend Wilkinson. He not only lost Ethel, his sister in law, but just 6 months earlier he saw the death of his son Clarence, who was killed at Gallipoli, fighting alongside the Australian and New Zealand Anzac forces. Of course, the Reverend must also have comforted the families of most of the men listed on the 1914 - 1918 panels of the war memorial.

Ethel died, not in the corner of a foreign field, but here, in our village. But she was no less a victim of the Great War than any Tommy who spent his war in a trench, or a Jack Tar aboard a battleship. Ethel's name is remembered in Stradbroke church in the north of the county.



Boxes can be left at 39 Timperleys – we will deliver them in the new year.


