FLOWTON IN FLOWER

17-18 June 2023

The tiny Suffolk village of Flowton - in the middle of nowhere but only a short distance from Ipswich - is opening its gardens and holding a colourful flower festival for the first time in four years.

There will be at least nine very different gardens to visit, and Flowton's wonderful 13th century church will host a spectacular flower festival themed around 'Our church, our community.' There will also be amazing displays of military vehicles, classic cars and vintage tractors, and a local history exhibition. Refreshments, lunches and cream teas will be available throughout the weekend at St Mary's Church.

Proceeds will go to help maintain St Mary's Church, Flowton, and to FIND (Families in Need), the local Ipswich food and furniture bank which provides crucial support to many local families and individuals in need. The flower festival and church will be open from 11.00 am to 5.00 pm on Saturday 17 and Sunday 18 June. Gardens will be open from 12.00 to 5.00 both days.



HINTLESHAM & CHATTISHAM PARISH COUNCIL AGM MEETING NOTES

NOTES FROM THE MEETING OF THE PARISH COUNCIL AGM HELD ON THURSDAY 11 MAY 2023

Present at the meeting were 8 Parish Councillors, 1 District Councillor and three members of the public.

Election of a Chairperson and Officers took place. Les Cole was proposed as Chairperson this was unanimously supported by all councillors. The Parish Council currently have vacancies for 2 councillors.

District Councillor report

Cllr Busby reported that discussions were taking place regarding leadership following the results of the local elections.

Members of Public were invited to speak and discussions took place regarding several road work issues in the villages. Concern was expressed about the ground works taking place on the old waterworks site near Wolves Wood on the 1071. Babergh Planning enforcement would be approached for further clarification.

The recently elected Chair of the Community Council - Robert Smith attended and introduced himself to the Parish Council.

DC/22/05127 Application for Outline Planning Permission (Access Points to be considered, Appearance, Layout, Landscaping and Scale to be reserved) Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) - Erection of 5No. dwellings with associated cart lodges and parking (re-submission of withdrawn application DC/21/06539). | Land North Of Clay Hill Hintlesham Suffolk.

Discussions took place regarding the Charity Farm site in Chattisham and LC requested Cllr Busby to meet with planning and enforcement at the site to discuss further.

Councillors - Neighbourhood Plan

Cllr JW is currently looking at other neighbouring parishes to help progress ours. Concerns remain regarding traffic through the village (particularly at Policeman's Corner) and the state of repair of Chattisham Lane and a noisy grid cover in George Street. Motorcycles were still being driven at speed along the 1071 at weekends. The VAS (Vehicle Activated Sign) along the 1071 is currently down for servicing.






