The heartbeat of Hintlesham & Chattisham

If you've been watching The Euro football on TV, you will no doubt have been shocked by Christian Erikson's collapse in the game between Denmark and Finland. His life was saved by the medics' quick response and the use of a defibrillator. You may be heartened to know that we have the same brand of defibrillator located in our villages. Chattisham's Adrian Waller is an expert in this field and writes...

Sudden cardiac arrest is a problem which 60,000 people per year in the UK die from. Our Parish council invested in 3 Automated Defibrillators, sited in the two telephone boxes in Chattisham and Hintlesham and another outside the Community Hall opposite the MUGA.

In the event that someone suffers cardiac arrest, in your home or elsewhere in our villages, the first thing you need do is identify that they are unconscious and not breathing, this should quickly be followed by dialing 999 and asking for an ambulance. It is imperative you inform the operator that the casualty is unconscious and not breathing. If there is someone with you, instruct them to fetch the nearest defibrillator to you. At the same time whilst you wait for the defibrillator to arrive commence performing chest compressions on the casualty. It is important that chest compressions only are performed at a rate of about 100-120 compressions a minute. Because of COVID please do not give mouth to mouth ventilations.

Once the defibrillator arrives, remove the casualty's clothing from the waist up, switch the AED on and apply the electrode pads to the victim's chest as shown in the diagram on the electrodes. The device will then tell you to stop touching the patient and may advise "Press the flashing shock button". Please do not hesitate to press the button. The device may also say "No shock advised" in either case it is important you immediately commence CPR.

The AED is designed to make it easy for the likes of you and me to operate. Please continue to follow its commands and continue until the ambulance service arrives.

Once the government covid regulations are relaxed we will try and organise a couple more basic life support sessions in the Community hall.



Magnificent buzzards are routinely spotted soaring on the thermal currents above our villages. They appear to be thriving, but not all are so fortunate in being fit & healthy. For those wild animals which need veterinary care, one local charity is on hand to assist.

Several birds of prey, including a buzzard, arrived at SESAW needing intensive feeding due to the wet, cold Spring. One also had a fractured wing which was repaired by our vet. All have now returned to their natural environment including a Barn Owl which is being offered supplementary food to ensure a smooth transition back to the wild.

H&C Parish Council Meeting Notes -

Notes from the Parish Council meeting held at the Community Hall 10/6/21

A second, refreshingly welcome, 'face to face' meeting of our Parish Council. We were joined by our trusty District Councillor, Dave Busby. Sadly, Christopher Hudson gave his apologies and asked we consider he join our meetings remotely rather than 'in the flesh'. Christopher also indicated he would be prepared to contribute to the cost of the necessary equipment. This proposal was quickly rejected by councillors who felt it was contradictory to both UK Gov policy and his elected role process of engagement with the Council. We were also joined by 2 members of the public which is always good to see. Nine Councillors were present with apologies from Debbie.

District Councillor - Dave Busby, gave us an update on District Council activities. Dave provided the latest position on the potential development at Cobbolds Farm relating to the significant increase in commercial footprint. He also advised members that Babergh have a small parcel of land released to them via a Section 106 agreement to be developed nearby the Persimmon site adjacent to the A1071 (near Letts Swim). It seems likely this may form a combined business and retail park. Closer to home, councillors were disappointed that approval had been given to the retrospective planning application for the Livery Yard on Duke St. David indicated several conditions were in place and suggested if these were contravened, the BDC enforcement team should be notified.

County Councillor – Christopher Hudson, Sadly, in Christopher's absence, the council weren't able to discuss any County Council issues.

Members of the Public – As ever, 'traffic management' through and parked in the village was topical. Concern was raised at the parking of contractors' vehicles in Duke St in dangerous locations and also blocking pavement access. This remains a real problem in the village and is particularly dangerous for mums & dads with pushchairs or prams needing to circumnavigate these vehicles.

Richard (Youngs) confirmed the police speed check activity with 10 offenders. The expected arrival of ANPR cameras will, potentially, be a significant contribution to our ability to improve traffic management through the village. Sadly, the impact of the checks is still being diluted by social media 'tip offs' which is particularly frustrating when we are being supported so well by Suffolk Police who share our concern over traffic speeds in the village. Planning

DC/21/02835 – Wellington Cottage, Duke St, Hintlesham. (The erection of single storey extension) Councillors raised no objection to their plans.

DC/21/03025 – Park Farm House, Back Road, Hintlesham. (The replacement of 10 windows) Councillors raised no objection to their plans.

DC/21/03144 – Linden Cottages, Duke St, Hintlesham. (Discharge of Conditions – Refuse bins & Collection area, Construction Management & Suffolk Habitats Sites Mitigation) Councillors raised no objection to their plans.

DC/21/02783 – Land to the East of Duke St, Hintlesham. (Discharge of Conditions – First Occupation and Commencement of Development & Archaeological Works) Councillors raised no objection to their plans.

DC/21/02835 – Newhaven, Duke St, Hintlesham. (The erection of single storey front extension following removal of existing porch) Councillors raised no objection to their plans.

DC/21/02835 – Church Farm, Lower Barn Road, Chattisham. (Discharge of Conditions – Materials & Fenestration) Councillors raised no objection to their plans.

PC Meeting Recording Draft Policy was discussed at length. The Council is currently considering the draft document. A consensus, subject to one or two amendments, was agreed and a further document will be submitted for consideration and approval to the next meeting.

Councillor Vacancies – The Council now has 2 vacancies, one for a 'Hintlesham' Councillor and a second for a 'Chattisham' Councillor. Full application details are lodged, via a link, on the village website.

Playground Resurfacing & Additional Works – The Community Council had reported to the Parish Council that unexpected additional works would be required to the play equipment due to the timber legs being predominantly rotten. The Community Council had agreed to have these repaired with steel collars. These additional costs will be covered by the Community Council, their request was that the Parish Council recover the VAT element of the cost. Councillors were concerned that this may not be appropriate and asked the Clerk to take advice prior to a decision being agreed. **National Grid (Bramford to Twinstead)** – Peter gave councillors a succinct update on activity around this matter.

Finance – Councillors agreed to the presented expenses.

Footpaths – Reported on by Councillor Stephanie. She confirmed there were issues on footpath 7 which were being dealt with as was the gate on footpath 17. Les confirmed the footpath through the St Nicholas' area is overgrown and needs a 'trim'.

Public Transport – Reported on by Councillor Ben Cox. Ben confirmed bus services had resumed and a Saturday bus now runs. Timetables are on the village website. **Red GPO Boxes** – The box on Duke St is scheduled for a 're-paint' thanks to a willing volunteer. Sadly, the same can't be said for the Chattisham box as no one has come forward to help. Di Chase said she would attempt to find one. Any Chattisham resident reading these notes 'Your phone box needs you'..! I'm sure Di would love to hear from you.

The full minutes of this meeting will be published on the village website.
