Mark Walters writes:

Emma and I came to Suffolk in the late 90's with our daughters, aged 9, 7 and 3 to take up a job offer with Eastern at Wherstead Park. We were fortunate to find an attractive barn conversion for sale in Hintlesham, the 'locals' were enormously welcoming and we settled in very quickly. It turned out that we had found a very special place to raise our family.

Our move to Chattisham in 2007 gave the girls more space in their teenage years without leaving the parish. Now, for the first time in 50 years I know the names of nearly everyone in my street, and many have become good friends. In these villages we benefit from both the beautiful Suffolk countryside around us, and a caring community. The range of activities available for all ages is staggering; an outstanding school, numerous clubs, societies, youth groups, the golf club, the MUGA, Pilates – something for everyone. We also have two very active churches led by our inspiring vicar, Jackson, and the wider interest "Chattitude" events.



Now in their twenties and thirties our daughters have left home, so our thoughts idly drift towards downsizing, but we can't imagine leaving the area. There would be so much to lose.

Are there any smudges on my rose-tinted lenses? Well, I hate the speeding through our villages and the litter – especially takeaway food packaging - dropped from vehicles. I don't see the need in the twenty-first century for more overhead wires when they could be underground. And I'm concerned that some people still think the church community is exclusive and unwelcoming to newcomers. I believe the opposite is true, everyone is very welcome.

Nothing is perfect but these two villages are very special and for me 'the view from here' is a very enviable one.

H&C Parish Council Meeting Notes -Held via Zoom on 8th April 2021

Present: 12 Parish Councillors, County Councillor Christopher Hudson, District Councillor David Busby, the Parish Clerk and six members of the public.

The Chair opened the meeting by introducing the new Clerk Tamsin Pearce

County Councillor Report

Councillor Hudson advised that he had had a meeting, organised by Burstall PC with Suffolk MP's Dan Poulter and James Cartlidge to discuss the proposed Bramford to Twinstead power line. The MP's advised that in addition to this line there was also a further proposal for a line from Norwich to Tilbury, details of which National Grid had as yet to disclose. The MP's had written to the Minister of State for Business, Energy and Clean Growth, requesting her to suspend the consultation until full details of both routes had been published. This was so that the full impact of the cumulative impact of the scheme could be considered. It was also pointed out to the MP's that cumulative impact of the proposed solar farms between Somersham and Bramford should be considered before the applications were determined, in addition to the power lines.

District Councillor Report

Councillor Busby advised that Babergh were updating plans for footpath and cycle routes and that they welcomed input from interested parties. He had attended a meeting with Highways England about proposed improvements to the Copdock Roundabout which suggested that a new filter road or a flyover from the A12 to the A14 East was being considered.

<u>Planning</u>

DC/21/01427 Land to the Rear of Lilivan Duke Street Hintlesham- Change of use from agricultural to equestrian use, including



siting of ancillary touring caravan (retention of). There was unanimous rejection for this application. A detailed objection will be sent to the LPA.

DC/21/01447 Fairview, Duke Street, Hintlesham- Change of agricultural field to domestic garden. No Objection

DC/21/01494 California House, California Lane, Hintlesham- Erection of side garage extension. No Objection

DC21/01604 Phalmier, Duke Street, Hintlesham- Erection of two storey frontal extension to include porch. No Objection.

DC21/01419 Dale View, Washbrook Road, Hintlesham. Siting of residential Park Home for ancillary use to the host dwelling (following the removal of storage container). No Objection.

ANPR Speed Cameras

Suffolk Police are introducing a number of portable speed cameras. The PC agreed to request that we be put on the list for consideration in the scheme.

May PC Meeting and AGM

This meeting will be held on 20th May subject to Covid Restrictions being relaxed in line with the Government roadmap. This will allow the councillors to meet face to face and will be held in the Main Room of the Community Hall commencing at 7:30pm

National Grid's Bramford to Twinstead New Pylon Line Consultation

Closing Date 6th May 2021

Some of you may have received by post the information pack relating to this consultation, others may not have been so lucky!

Four local MP's, including our own, have written to the Energy Minister, requesting the suspension of the consultation.

Below is the response from the Parish Council.

In response to National Grid's nonstatutory consultation concerning a second transmission line from Bramford sub-station to Twinstead 'T' we would like to make the following points:

To have any validity, the consultation must look at the 'bigger picture'. Stakeholders across East Anglia should therefore be advised of all the options for grid reinforcement currently being considered, not merely the Bramford to Twinstead project. These include additional transmission lines in the immediate vicinity which would have a cumulative impact.

The planning implications of cumulative impact have been brought into sharp focus by the recent High Court Ruling overturning consent for Norfolk Vanguard. The implications of this ruling are now being seen in other NSIP applications on the Suffolk coast. Meanwhile, undersea alternatives are being considered under the umbrella of the Offshore Transmission Network Review and the Government has already accepted that offshore alternatives offer proven benefits.

Potential cumulative impact is already evident in the Bramford substation where numerous large solar estates and other forms of generation are proposed. Adding further industrial structures in the form of up to three extra transmission lines would have a dramatic impact.

It is incumbent on National Grid to present all the relevant information or – as in any planning application – to suspend the consultation until such information is available.

This Parish Council will not, therefore, respond further until such information is made available.
