AUDREY LORFORD

Roger Chase writes

It is with great sadness that we must record the death of Audrey Lorford on the 24th March.

Audrey was born in Chelsea in 1932, qualified as a Primary Teacher and taught in London for many years. Audrey married Michael and in 1965 they moved into Duke Street. As well as continuing as a Teacher, Audrey was involved in various village activities, it was during her role as Parish Council Clerk that she became the Village Recorder, really because no-one else was prepared to. It was this decision that inspired her to devote so much of her time to research and preserve the history of Hintlesham and Chattisham.

It would be impossible to quantify the effort that Audrey spent in pursuit of her new aim, she learnt to read Latin so that she could translate documents and was passionate about the medieval period. She was relentless in tracking down records, photographs, interviewing people for their memories, nothing was too much trouble for her to record the history of the community that she cared so much about. Much of this was done completely at her own expense.

It was this collection that led to several exhibitions and then, after many years' work the publication of Hintlesham and Chattisham, The Story of Two Suffolk Villages. This she had undertaken with Diane Chase and the support of Michael Downes-Martin.

Anyone who knew Audrey will remember a lovely warm, caring person whose company was always delightful. Whether you knew her not you can only be grateful for her incredible contribution to our community. There will be a memorial service at St. Nicholas Church, Hintlesham on Tuesday May 2nd at 12p.m. There will then be a short family time at the Crematorium Afterwards there will be cake and champagne at Vine Cottage, Duke St at 1.45 to celebrate Audrey's life.

NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD IN THE COMMUNITY HALL, THURSDAY 13th APRIL 2023

There were 10 Parish Councillors present and 2 members of the public. There were no reports from either the County or District Councillors this month.

POT HOLES There were several reports of Pot Holes on our local roads. Chattisham Lane is very bad also Policemans Corner. The Chairman reported that these problems had been reported to Highways. Just a waiting game as to when they will be repaired.

ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR It has been noted by the Parish Council that laminated posters have been put up on one of our Public Footpaths. The wording is very inappropriate. Please see notice elsewhere in the Link. It also appears that the Clothing Bank at the Community Hall was broken into, the door to the Playing Field Hut forced open and Graffiti on the Bus Shelter on Wilderness Hill. Les Cole and Robin Baldry cleaned the Bus Shelter thanks must go to them both for doing this.

VAS SIGN It seems that the casing on our first VAS sign we purchased has cracked. The Chairman has got a quote for a repair, this will go on the next Agenda in May. Unfortunately it is out of guarantee. The post for the VAS sign has now been erected near

Dukes Park and is now in use. **NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN** The Chairman has met up with members from Sproughton and Element Parich

up with members from Sproughton and Elmsett Parish Councils to get their feelings on Neighbourhood plans and how they approached doing theirs. The Chair of Elmsett is willing to come and discuss this project with our Parish Councillors hopefully in May/June.

MANHOLE COVER IN GEORGE STREET

This still has NOT been repaired, very annoying for the house owner who lives next to it. Let's hope Suffolk County Council Highways Department gets it sorted soon.

No objection to the application, however we have 3 concerns which should be considered:

- 1 Move the mast and associated cabinets as far from the kerb-line as possible to reduce visual impact.
- 2 Provide a drop kerb and vehicle hard standing, to prevent service vehicles negotiating the kerb on a bend in the road with the potential to cause a road traffic collision (service vehicles are proposed every 3 - 6 months)
- 3 The mast and associated cabinets are in a direct line of sight for the Parish Council owned and operated VAS (Vehicle Activated Speed Sign), this is mounted on a 30MPH repeater post at a location approved by Suffolk County Council Highways.

The proposed location for the new mast and cabinets will block the VAS radar signal from capturing the vehicles as they enter the village.

If the EE mast proposal is approved, would it be possible for EE or their contractors to either install a new VAS post in an approved location or cover the SCC cost of £570.00 for the installation of a new post.
