#### Notes from the Chattisham and Hintlesham Parish Council Meeting held on 12th October 2023

#### Diane Chase writes

There were 6 Councillors present and 6 members of the public.

John Whyman is helping to cover for our District Councillor Dave Busby and his report was read out. (see website)

#### PLANNING:

DC/23/04442 Application for advertisement consent. Erection of 2 signs at the entrance to the former Woodlands Farm shop (now an IT company)

No objection but suggested it moved to the other side of the existing sign away from the road.

#### GENERAL:

Frank Wilkin will repair both noticeboards in Timperleys and Duke Street.

Peter Beale will be provided with a Hi Vis vest when strimming grass on behalf of the Parish Council.

David Marsh will have the opportunity to talk on Radio Suffolk and will mention the ongoing problems with the road in Silver Hill, The noisy drain cover and uneven surfaces that have not been dealt with over a long period of time. He will also mention the ongoing road problems at Policeman's Corner in spite of numerous Parish Council requests. The Chattisham Play area will be registered and the Parish Council will be in overall control although the Community Council will be in charge of the amenities.

Three members of the public have applied for the two posts of Parish Councillors.

They all spoke briefly about themselves and a decision will be made at the next meeting.

Two people from outside the village have applied for the Clerk's position and interviews will be held shortly.

It was agreed that the Chairman will buy some speed signs for wheelies. Residents who would like one can ask for a free sticker.

The new VAS sign has been erected in George Street with some success, as no one was caught speeding at the last speed check session.

A Highways and Speed Management report for Duke Street has been received with various ideas for traffic calming. (see web site)

At a recent Police Forum meeting the main local issues are speeding and anti-social behaviour. The issue with noisy motorbikes racing through Hintlesham every Sunday morning was again mentioned but the police will not be prepared to come along at 6.30 am to catch the cyclists.


