

I would like to record my sincere thanks to all those cricketers, and supporters from our parish who contributed so generously to an excellent afternoon of cricket in our H&C v Kersey match on 10 Sept. over at the picturesque Rockalls ground in Polstead. Special thanks to Barry W., who expertly and stoically umpired for all the 49 overs in the sizzling Suffolk sunshine, armed with only 6 pebbles and a bottle of water!

Having fallen a tantalising 1 run short in last year's fixture, H&C managed to restore the balance with a nail-biting victory this year. Kersey compiled a solid 136 off their 25 overs with young Alex S. the pick of the H&C bowlers with

3 wickets for only 5 runs off his 3 overs, ably backed up by some tight bowling particularly from Stuart K and Tom J. Alex then swapped ball for bat and got the H&C innings well underway in an excellent opening stand with Glen A. Chris H. and Stuart K. each contributed useful runs but the wickets steadily fell; players' and spectators' finger-nails got ever shorter! With 10 runs still required, Alex (having earlier retired with 30 runs to his name) duly returned to join H&C's last man at the crease and helped to see H&C through to victory by 1 wicket in the penultimate over!

It was stated that Babergh will try and push initiatives down to parish councils and the local community due to its low resources moving forward.

Permission for 750 homes have been granted for the Wolsey Grange development at Sproughton.

MEET THE NEW VICAR

There is a legal difference between a vicar and a rector, but for the purpose of this report we shall treat them as being one and the same. Link reporter, Gerald Main, has been chatting to the vicar of Hintlesham, Geoffrey Clement, who technically is a rector rather than a vicar, and lives in Elmsett, one of five villages in the Benefice.

Here's a question for the next quiz night at The George: What's the connection between Jeremy Clarkson's Diddly Squat farm, the winners of the 1930 football World Cup, Westminster Abbey and St Nicholas church in Hintlesham. The answer is our new rector. Geoffrey Clement was recently appointed Rector of Hintlesham, Chattisham, Elmsett and Kersey. He doesn't mind being called either Geoff or Geoffrey but at school it's "Vicar Geoffrey." His working life began as a stone mason working on churches in London, including Westminster Abbey, and he even put his chisel and mallet to work on the nooks and crannies of Westminster Palace. His next stop took him to the football mad South American country of Uruguay where he was given the opportunity to volunteer to work for a diocese and train for the ministry. The process was complex enough, but to complete his training he had to become fluent in both written and spoken Spanish. Upon returning to the UK he took on a number of church roles in and around Suffolk, including a time as rector of Holbrook. There his love of motorbikes

quite often led him to exploring the highways and byways between Hintlesham and Lavenham in his quest to become an advanced motorcyclist. His love for this part of the world also grew from holidaying in a motor home in the county, with Dunwich being a favourite spot. Geoffrey's parents lived in Woodbridge and Angela has strong family links to Wherstead.

Random facts about Geoffrey

Given the choice between a pint of Greene King and a pint of Adnams, Geoffrey would prefer Adnams.

His favourite food is Indian cuisine, however if he's taking Angela, his wife, out for a meal, he would seek out a Chinese restaurant. They have two grown-up children, Charles and Nicola, who are both in their twenties.

The first record Geoffrey bought was Metal Guru, a hit for T Rex in 1972, whic50+ ye later Geoffrey describes as it as an epic tune.

The 59 year-old rector can recite Euler's formula to 1500 places (the formula has something to do with trigonometry and compound interest, however the Link leaves the reader to seek out any further explanation at their leisure).

Geoffrey has 2 dogs, Bob and Bridget who, despite their names, are both girls. You can ask Geoffrey about this if you see him walking the dogs but don't get him started on Euler's formula.

Geoffrey's favourite hymn is "Tell Out



My Soul" which he describes as having a cracking tune. One can imagine it being belted out across the Cotswolds by congregations adjacent to Jeremy Clarkson's farm near Chipping Norton, where Geoffrey ministered immediately before returning to Suffolk.

The new rector is keen to acknowledge and build upon the work which has already taken place to develop the churchs "family and maintain the churches on his "patch". He is well aware that the future of the church in every regard depends on engaging with young people and he is looking forward to being involved at the local schools and to developing worship which resonates with younger generations.

He did however balk at the thought of holding raves in the nave, saying the most important item on his to-do list is making Church accessible to families who might find the whole prospect of being part of a church family rather alien!
